Women's Health Clinic

The WestView Primary Care Network's Women's Health Clinic is held weekly on Wednesdays mornings in Spruce Grove. The Women's Health Clinic is staffed by local female family doctors and public health nurses to help care for women age 12-70:

- Who may have a regular male family doctor but prefer to see a female doctor for medical examination and other health care needs relating to women's issues, i.e. healthy sexuality, menopause, preventative health maintenance (mammograms, bone density tests, cervical screening, breast examinations, etc.)
- Who may be a young female requiring care and counseling for sexually transmitted diseases, unplanned pregnancy, contraceptive management
- Who does not have a regular family doctor

WestView Primary Care Network

is a locally developed initiative, in which local family doctors work with Alberta Health Services - Edmonton Zone to improve the delivery of basic, everyday health services for patients

What is primary care?

Primary care is the first point of contact people have with the health system - it's where you and your family receive care for your everyday health needs. It's the care provided by your family doctor, and other health care professionals such as nurses, dietitians, mental health workers, pharmacists, etc. Regular check-ups ... care for pregnant women and childbirth ... care for chronic illness ... counseling ... these are all examples of primary care.

What is a Primary Care Network?

In each **Primary Care Network (PCN)**, a group of local family physicians and Alberta Health Services work together to provide and coordinate comprehensive primary care services for patients. In addition, Networks also coordinate with other areas of the health system such as emergency departments, home care, public health, long-term care, lab and X-ray and other services.

The **PCN** also provides an opportunity to develop a variety of programs for patient care and may hire or link with other health professionals to provide some health services. For example, a **Primary Care Network** may introduce a chronic disease program to follow up with patients with conditions like diabetes or heart disease. Doctors could work with other professionals like nurses and dietitians to see these patients

Each **PCN** is unique, with its own ideas and programs to improve delivery of primary care services.

Who are we at the WestView Primary Care Network?

- ❖ +70 family doctors and emergency physicians working in Spruce Grove, Stony Plain and Parkland County
- ❖ Nurses, pharmacists, dietitians, and other health care providers working in doctor's offices
- ❖ Allied health professionals at the WestView Health Centre and in the community
- ❖ Alberta Health Services



What does this mean to you?

- ❖ The patient-doctor relationship you have with your family doctor remains the same.
- ❖ Any medical and health care services that are funded by Alberta Health and Wellness and Alberta Health Services will continue to be publicly funded.

As a patient in this Network, you will receive the following additional services, when needed:

- ❖ Access to after-hours care by a family or emergency room physician in the [WestView Primary Care Network After-hours Clinic](#).
- ❖ Nurses, pharmacists, dietitians working in your family doctor's office to provide you with more comprehensive care and to link you with other health services that you may need.
- ❖ A [Women's Health Clinic](#) for women wishing to see a female doctor for their medical examination and a public health nurse for counseling and other support.
- ❖ An [Obesity Clinic](#) to provide the highest quality care for area residents with chronic obesity and obesity related medical conditions.
- ❖ A [Chronic Pain Clinic](#) for patients (with non-malignant chronic pain) to obtain pain management and coordination of traditional therapies. The Clinic also provides support group sessions for patients and their families.
- ❖ A [Shared Care Maternity Family Practice Program](#) where expectant mothers can have their complete pregnancy care provided by local family physicians who deliver at the Misericordia Hospital in Edmonton.
- ❖ More family doctors caring for residents in the long term care facilities and providing obstetrical services to expectant mothers.
- ❖ New programs and more health professionals to help you manage complex and chronic health issues.
- ❖ Family doctors working with a mental health therapists to develop and coordinate community programs that enhance the mental health of our population.
